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Have you noticed how every other programme on TV these days is about cooking? Well, I firmly believe in keeping up with the times. So here's my recipe for a great jazz festival!

First of all, keep the music

entertaining. Profound yes - but entertaining too; that's important. Oh. and stylistically and culturally broad so there's something for everyone. Then take the music and place it in a huge variety of free settings; everything from starry concert stages to street events so that everyone has a chance to hear the happenings. Your mix of artists is a central factor involving detailed research and artistic judgment. It must include established names to stiffen your programme; locally-based players whose star-status is in no way diminished because they happen to live locally, and - just as importantly - new talented arrivals from as many international locations as possible. Be sure to check your ingredients to make sure that the quality of your dish isn't spoiled by musical economies. And then sit back, treat yourself to a glass of something warming, and watch the magic happen!

International Jazz and Blues Festival is with us now, and it's plain that – once again – director Jim Simpson and his Big Bear team have got it exactly right. Cast an eye down the list of attractions here and you'll see that

the recipe above has been followed to the hilt. In and around the city you can marvel at British Jazz Award winners including saxophone showstoppers Simon Spillett, Derek Nash and Art Themen; the mighty trumpeter Bruce Adams, and singer Val Wiseman (absolutely the best in her field). For comedy at its most crafted there's Bob Kerr and his legendary Whoopee Band; for rock aficionados there's the great group of Trevor Burton (late of the legendary Move) and the finest jump'n'jive ensemble in the world, King Pleasure and the Biscuit Boys! Both of these acts hail from Birmingham and they're joined by other megatalents from the city too; singer Roy Forbes, saxophonist Steve Ajao, pianist John Patrick and more.

But of course that's not all. Have a look at the jazz and blues map of the world and you'll find that many of its best representatives will be here. The USA, France, Lithuania, Spain, Slovakia, Hungary, Luxembourg, Italy and the Czech Republic have all brought some of their finest acts to Birmingham this year in an exercise that gives the United Nations a musical run for its (or should that be 'their') money! As Patron of the Festival I've been allowed a preview of a few of them and they are sensational. The dynamic Pepper and the Jellies (a four-piece from Italy led by the beautiful Pepper) bring the blues music of Bessie Smith to fresh youthful life. The Budapest Ragtime Band presents the music with grace and heat combined. Steve Seagal's Blues Band from the USA lay down their righteous message. And that's just a start. Check the programme and have fun making your own great musical discoveries.

And – by the way - have a wonderful Festival!

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ALLIGATOR GUMBO

Alligator Gumbo are an exciting Leeds based swing band, with a line-up of clarinet, violin, trumpet, trombone, washboard, accordion, steel guitar and double bass. They play New Orleans swing/jazz from the 1920s era with songs made popular by the likes of Louis Armstrong, King Oliver, and Jelly Roll Morton, performed in the traditional style of upbeat tempos, entertaining improvisations and footstomping swinging rhythms.



ART THEMEN

The wonderfully original saxophonist Art Themen managed throughout a long and successful career as an orthopaedic surgeon to build a major reputation on the British jazz and blues scene, initially picking up national awards with the Cambridge University Jazz Band, then plaving and touring with the likes of Alexis Korner, Mick Jagger and Jack Bruce before lending his Sonny Rollins-influenced tenor sax into many top jazz groups. Since retirement from medicine, Art has gone from strength to strength, with the British Jazz Award for tenor sax coming his way in 2008.

ARTHUR BROWN JAZZ BAND

Having led his own band for many years, trumpeter Arthur Brown joined Pete Allen's band and then had a spell leading a band in Spain. On his return to the Midlands, he formed his present band which appears regularly throughout the region and annually at the Birmingham Festival. Arthur remains dedicated to the robust buccaneering style of Dixieland.

BACKYARD MUSIC BOYS

This four piece acoustic band captures the excitement and verve of 1920s/1930s hot jazz. Lining up with clarinet, trumpet, sousaphone and banjo, led by Matt Palmer, they are equally comfortable strolling or static onstage.

BARBARA AND ALL THAT JAZZ

Barbara and All That Jazz Formed in 2001, Barbara and All That Jazz is a seven piece band with long established and versatile musicians, Led by singer Barbara Taylor and performing mostly traditional jazz and blues, the band plays most of the Midlands jazz clubs, plus the Upton and Abersoch festivals.

BECKY BRINE

The West Country's 'Jazzeoke Queen', Totnes-based Becky Brine will be remembered with affection by Birmingham patrons for her solo street entertainment. Always a little unconventional in her approach to marketing, Becky kick-started her jazz singing career by busking and still goes out to windy

Bekah's Renegades have recently burst onto the Midlands blues scene, a five-piece fronted by Rebekah Downes, whose unique and powerful voice draws on influences ranging from blues and soul to jazz and rock.

Rebekah's voice and performances have been, quite rightly, likened to such legendary artists as the full on Tina Turner, the bluesy feel of Etta James, and the raw power of Janis Joplin.

BIG JOE PLEASURE

Big Joe is one of the great jazz and swing performers. When the Boss of the Blues holds sway, nobody is in any doubt who's in charge. His ebullient singing is matched by his fine tenor and baritone sax playing in a memorably swinging package.

BOB HALL & DAVE PEABODY

Bob. described by Folk Roots as 'the finest blues and boogie piano player this side of the Atlantic'. first came to fame in the Rhythm 'n' Blues explosion of the 1960s, as a founder member of The Groundhogs and later Savoy Brown. Later he acted as accompanist to countless US bluesmen such as John Lee Hooker, Howlin' Wolf, Little Walter, Jimmy Witherspoon, Chuck Berry, Homesick James, Lightnin' Slim and Charlie Musselwhite. Guitarist Dave Peabody has been voted Acoustic Blues Artist of

the Year three times by the British Blues Connection and Blues in Britain magazine. He's also been first choice accompanist for such American blues legends as David 'Honeyboy' Edwards and Charlie Musselwhite.

BOB KERR & HIS WHOOPEE BAND

Bob Kerr and his Whoopee Band return to Birmingham after last year's appearance at the Botanical Gardens. According to its publicity it is a jazz band which started in 1967 and continues to perform today. It is, of course, much more than that, possibly the last of the great comedy jazz bands that combine zany musical and visual humour with lively iazz and impeccable musicianship. The Whoopee Band was originally an offshoot of the eclectic Bonzo Dog Doo-Dah Band, and Bob himself, who is mainly featured on trumpet and cornet, was a member


CBD FOOD FESTIVAL

Digby founded the Association of British Jazz Musicians (1987) and National Jazz Archive (1987) and broadcast widely on jazz for the BBC and Jazz FM (1986-1998) before returning to fulltime playing in 1998. In 2013 he received the Worshipful Company of Musicians' Lifetime Achievement Award for jazz. His group, Digby Fairweather's Half Dozen. has won the British Jazz Award for small group for eight of the last nine years and currently he is delighted to be Patron of the Birmingham International Jazz Festival!

The Electric Swing Circus is a 6-piece fusion of saucy 1920s swing and stomping electro beats. With an explosive sound that reverberates back through time, the ESC hotfoot their way through everything from breakbeat and house to reggae and dubstep, all with their own unique style of swing.


Fresh off the UK/Europe festival circuit for 2013. the ESC's live set includes electric double bass, vintage samples, gypsy-jazz guitar, keys, drums, synths and electro beats. Fronted by a sassy female double-act, the ESC delivers a consistently dazzling show.

ELVIS FONTENOT AND THE SUGAR BEES

Elvis Fontenot and the Sugar Bees were formed in 1992 and have developed their own take on cajun, zydeco, soul and blues which they call 'Swamp'n'roll'.







In 2006 and 2009 they were voted European Zydeco band of the year at the European Cajun and Zydeco Awards in Holland. Nick Barber won European rubboard player of the year in 2009 and, as the award has not run again, he's still the undefeated champion!

EVE SELIS (U.S.A.)

with special guest Berkley Hart

Winner of seven San Diego Music Awards in Americana and Adult Alternative, Eve Selis is no stranger to Roots music. Her newest CD Family Tree features 14 sturdy tracks drawn from the dark, rich soil of American music, from the swamp-rock of *Rubber* and *Glue* to the plaintive country heartbreaker *Don't* You Feel Lonesome to Leonard Cohen's majestic masterpiece *Hallelujah*.

FLORENCE JOELLE (FRANCE)

Bred on jazz at home, and on the music of the Paris streets, the Gypsy art of Django Reinhardt, bal musette, and North African rai, singer/songwriter/blues harmonica player Florence Joelle started collecting rock'n'roll, doo-wop, Latin jazz, and early blues as a girl. Her music draws from

all these influences, carving out a unique sound that, although deeply rooted in the past, vibrates in the present.

GARY WILLIAMS



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International Jazz and Blues Festival, Giedre Kilciauskiene returns this year with her full band. She adds intelligence and taste to a marvellous voice of unique sweet timbre, bright and wide palette, perfect pitch and controlled power.

Pianist and arranger Andrej Polevikov, her regular collaborator who appeared with her at Birmingham 2013, is joined in Jazz Miniatures by Vytis Nivinskas (bass) and Darius Rudis (drums). The Jazz Miniatures quartet has just released their first CD Jazz Miniatures.

GREY GOOSE BLUES BAND

Formed in 2008 by singer/ songwriter/guitarist Frankie Williams, the Grey Goose is fast developing a reputation in the Midlands as the freshest and most original blues band around. Having cut their teeth on the Black Country pub circuit, Williams, bass quitarist Rufus T Watson, drummer Chuddy Mitchel and harmonica player 'Lil' Dave Smith have played many major blues festivals since 2010: Nantwich, Upton-upon-Severn,



Tewkesbury, Swanage, Shetland, Aber Jazz and Blues and, of course, Birmingham International Jazz and Blues.

HARRY BOLT TRIO

Having studied at the Birmingham Conservatoire, pianist Harry Bolt is now making a name for himself in the jazz world, touring with the Clark Tracey Quartet.


JAKE LEG JUG BAND

The Jake Leg Jug Band bring you the authentic sounds of 1920's and 30's America - jazz, blues. gospel, ragtime - and put their own twist on it. Quickly gaining a reputation as a lively, feel-good band, their performance at the Congleton Jazz & Blues Festival drew the comment: 'Their image, style and performance was wonderful and you really did buy into the prohibition era feel of their set....wonderful sounds!'

The band's debut album Cotton Mouth was released in February 2013 on both CD and 10" vinyl format to critical acclaim. Its success led to them signing a recording contract with Lake Records - recording their new album Next Stop! as part of their Vintage Recording Project.

THE JAZZ BUDDIES

A new band, but every man a seasoned and respected Midlands musician. Committed to bringing new life to the Dixieland and traditional jazz classics of Louis Armstrong, Jack Teagarden, Jelly Roll Morton et al, this band has the firepower to do just that. Fronted by trumpet player Arthur Brown, The Jazz Buddies field reedman Matt Palmer, trombonist Mike Owen, Brian Mellor on banio and guitar, Dennis Mowatt on double bass and drummer Tim Jones.





THE JAZZ RAMBLERS

Banjo/guitar player Brian Mellor gathers a group of like-minded musicians for a programme of good time jazz, loosely based on the music of the 1930s and 1940s, with the emphasis on variety and entertainment.

JAZZBAND VELKE LOSINY [CZECH REPUBLIC]

Velke Losiny is the town in the Czech Republic where it all began for the Teens Jazzband (as they were then known) in 2002. Now, still full of youthful exuberance, the band has the experience of 12 years of brilliant success. Many top Czech musicians, including Petra Ernyei, well known to Birmingham festival audiences, have guested with the band which made a huge impact at the 2011 and 2012 Birmingham festivals.

THE JIVEOHOLICS

Wales's finest 6 piece Jump Jive band, The Jiveoholics take the tunes of the 1940's jump jive era and the early 1950's rock'n'roll scene and give them a little twist of fun and pzazz. Classics like There ain't nobody here but us chickens and Flip, Flop and Flv snuggle comfortably alongside the revivalist hits Stray Cat Strut and Mr Pinstripe Suit. Fronted by the fabulous Kitty L'Etoile, the band performs a humorous and energetic show perfect for dancers, festival goers and all those in search of a good time.

JOHN HEMMING AND THE SISTERS OF JAZZ

Having played for MPs, peers, and the national and regional media at their debut gig at the Liberal Democrat Conference, John Hemming and the Sisters of Jazz have also featured on ITV.

Having a sitting Member



of Parliament on piano makes the band unusual and the professionalism of the sax players who also perform as the Giocoso Sax Quartet (yes, there are five!) makes for a very tight and interestingly harmonic front line

JOHN PATRICK

John Patrick's piano playing has graced the performances of many American stars who have visited the country since the



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1960s. For many years John fronted his own big band, but he is at his best in a small group playing hardswinging modern jazz.

KANSAS SMITTY'S BIG FOUR

Smitty's Big Four is the feisty little brother of the London-based Kansas Smitty's House Band. While the House Band draws its main inspiration from Count Basie and Kansas City, the Big Four is interested in the music of Sidney Bechet and the upbeat swing of New Orleans. The Big Four's unique combination of trumpet, soprano sax/ clarinet, guitar and bass, separates the group from traditional Dixieland groups. Smitty's Big Four have performed at many London venues and were recently featured on BBC Radio 2.

KING PLEASURE & THE BISCUIT BOYS

'To those who say that Swing is a musical form best left to Americans, prepare to be proven wrong. This British combo is bulletproof!' - Atomic Magazine, New York City

The all-time festival favourites at Birmingham, King Pleasure and the Biscuit Boys make it a regular stopping point on the international round of jazz and blues festivals.



The band's driving force since its inception way back when, King Pleasure is one of the great jazz and swing performers. His ebullient, joyful singing has long been the band's great trademark, his fine tenor and baritone playing an integral part of that roaring King Pleasure & The Biscuit Boys ensemble sound that is guaranteed to swing anyone into bad health.

LEE JONES TRIO

Highly respected guitarist Lee Jones graduated from Birmingham Conservatoire's jazz course with Honours, studying with Phil Robson from The Partisans. He has become a feature on the UK jazz scene, appeared as a special guest of Martin Taylor and is the winner of Jazz FM's Best New Instrumentalist award. He's currently working on his third solo album. He is accompanied by Dane Cranenburg on bass and lan Russell on drums.

LEWIS FLOYD HENRY

Returning to the Birmingham Jazz Festival, rock'n'roll whirlwind Lewis Floyd Henry is a one-man band with plenty of soul and licks that Clapton would happily claim as his own. In hipster London Lewis is known as the Balladeer of Brick Lane, the Hendrix of Hackney or the Dylan of Dalston!

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'The unlikely hit of the Big Chill, Henry sets up in fields, armed with a guitar played with his teeth and tiny drum kit played with his feet. A one-man band Jimi Hendrix Experience. Possibly quite mad, but brilliant.' – Dave Simpson, The Guardian

LITTLE JO & THE MISFITS

Little Jo & the Misfits are a six piece band from Runcorn. They are quickly gaining a reputation for themselves as the band to have at festivals and venues, as they bring a fresh sound and variety of material rarely seen in the UK today.

Formed in early 2012, Little Jo & the Misfits draw influence from a wide spectrum of artists such as Louis Jordan. Imelda May. Little Walter. T Bone Walker and Billie Holliday... it's a long list.

THE MAGNOLIA SISTERS (U.S.A.)

"These ladies are not only gifted musicians but trusted folklorists who are keeping their traditions alive." -Billboard Magazine

The Magnolia Sisters is a band of four women who can play the whole gamut of musical styles from southwest Louisiana: Cajun, Creole, dancehall favourites, and front porch ballads. Because of their many rhythmic styles they are loved by dancers, who marvel at the variety of fun grooves they play.

They each switch from one instrument to another during their shows, with accordion, fiddles and guitars to the fore. A musical evening with Magnolia Sisters is a fun and enriching experience as they explain the meanings of the songs, move between accordion two-steps, twin fiddle tunes, heavy bass Creole hits, dancehall standards and a cappella ballads. Their CD Stripped Down (Arhoolie Records) was nominated for a Grammy in 2010.





MAYSA (U.S.A.)

On a rare European tour, Baltimore-born Maysa is pleased to be in Birmingham for the 30th International Jazz & Blues Festival.

Maysa first appeared in the UK in the early 'Nineties as the lead singer of the Jazzfunk band Incognito (Don't you Worry 'bout a Thing) appearing on over nine Incognito recordings in her time with them.

Releasing her own self-titled debut album in 1995, Maysa has recorded ten more solo albums since. Three of these, *Metamorphosis* (2008), A *Woman In Love* (2010), and *Motions In Love*(2011), have reached No 1 in the Billboard Contemporary Jazz Charts.

MIKE SANCHEZ

British singer, piano player and guitarist, Mike Sanchez is one of the most exciting and charismatic performers of rhythm & blues and rock

'n' roll in the world today. Notoriety first came to Mike with the Big Town Playboys, the band he formed in the 'eighties with Andy Silvester & Andy Fairweather-Low. He then became a full-time member of Bill Wyman's Rhythm Kings, fronting the band alongside Georgie Fame, Beverly Skeete, Albert Lee, Andy Fairweather-Low and Eddie Floyd on their annual world tours. Mike is currently involved in a number of touring line-ups, most notably his 6-piece outfit which continuously receives fabulous reviews throughout the blues scene across the UK and Europe.

MATT PALMER'S MILLENNIUM EAGLE JAZZ BAND

The Midlands-based Millennium Eagle Jazz Band emerged as a direct result of the demise in 2005 of the very popular Eagle Jazz Band, formed by Ken Ingram and Bob Smith in 1951. Matt Palmer had recently folded his Millennium Jazz Band to join the Eagles, so it was thought appropriate to include 'Millennium' in the name of the new band. The band's wide repertoire includes popular songs and classic jazz compositions of the 1920s, 1930s and 1940s.

NEW ORLEANS HOTSHOTS

Trombonist Dave Harmer brings the Hotshots back for their fourth Birmingham festival. The six-piece from the East Midlands play everything from New Orleans to Dixieland, with a good measure of ballads, blues and rags.

NEW ORLEANS JUMP BAND (SPAIN)

Banjo and Harmonica player Mike Izatt has lived in Spain

for 30 years, forming the New Orleans Jump Band in 1990. The band is multinational with musicians from Sweden, UK, Germany and Argentina and has become a favourite at Birmingham with its robust brand of Dixieland jazz.

PACIFICO BLUES

Pacifico Blues is a contemporary London blues outfit, house band of the Gibson City Blues Jam and the Hard Rock Cafe. Guitarist Chris Newland and harmonica player Paul Pacifico started playing blues together as a fun side-project in about 2005 having met and worked together through The AllStars Collective of Europe's top session musicians.

PAUL CARRACK

The former vocalist of Mike and The Mechanics and the voice behind world-wide hits

such as *How Long* by Ace, Squeeze's *Tempted* and, of course, the timeless classic *The Living Years*, Carrack is now firmly established as a solo performer.

In a successful career that spans 40 years, including guest appearances on over 60 albums, as well as writing for The Eagles, Diana Ross, Tom Jones, Michael McDonald and Jools Holland among others, Paul Carrack



has always had the ability to combine the contemporary with the timeless classic effortlessly.

PEPPER AND THE JELLIES (ITALY)

Predicted as one of the big hits of Birmingham 2014, Pepper and the Jellies are fronted by Ilenia Appicciafuoco who specialises in singing early jazz and blues: the presence





of Fats Waller and Annette Hanshaw clips on her Facebook page suggests her range of influences. In 2010 she met the piano player Paolo Fornara and the guitarist Floriano Andolfo and together they founded the Vaudeville Stomp Revue and recorded the album Low Down Mama. She's a permanent presence in Rome Cotton Club's calendar and in 2012 she published a greatest hits album called *llenia* Appicciafuoco and the Sticky Bones Live at The Cotton Club. In 2013, she founded The Pepper and the Jellies with Marco Galiffa (drummer) and Emiliano Macrini (double-bass player).

POTATO HEAD JAZZ BAND (SPAIN)

The Potato Head Jazz Band from Granada was one of the hits of Birmingham 2013. The sextet comprises musicians from around the globe and has performed at

many notable jazz festivals and clubs. The all-Spanish rhythm section is formed by Patricio Caparros on double bass, Jaime Parrizas on drums and banjoist Antonio Fernandez. In the front line Martin Torres (Argentina) on clarinet and Andrew Lynch (Australia) on tenor

sax join Spanish trumpeter

of traditional language, their live shows are full of energy, enthusiasm and imagination.

PRECIOUS PENNY PLUCKERS

Stirling-based Americana Swing band, the Precious Penny Pluckers are a trio with a story to tell. Jazz guitar influences, evocative double bass and powerful vocals make for the contagious jivey swing you'd imagine comes from the 1940's US Mid-West. Think songs of sorrow, hardship and all the other miseries that make for a good story with just the right amount of upbeat swing.

RACHEL HUTCHINGS

From Whitstable on the south-east coast of England comes Rachel Hutchings





with her authentic and stylish vocal delivery of jazz standards. With a voice that has been compared to Billie Holiday, she simply has to be listened to. There is nothing pastiche about Rachel's approach to well-turned jazz songs, however. Her style is alluring and distinctive, her tone melodic and mellow with a dash of pepper and salt. Her natural phrasing, clear diction and rhythmic swing pump new life into the old familiar.

THE RASCALS OF RHYTHM

The Rascals of Rhythm are a jazz band with a very distinctive sound which once heard becomes immediately recognisable. The band provides a refreshing visit to an era of carefree, swinging jazz as exemplified by the small groups of the 1930s, with a varied and unusual repertoire, from the classics of Morton and Armstrong, through Waller and Ellington,



to the wonderful tunesmiths whose work makes up the Great American Songbook.

REMI HARRIS TRIO

"At twenty five Harris is now acknowledged as one of the finest gypsy jazz guitarists in the country." - The Jazz Man

2014 looks like being the year that the jazz world sits up and takes notice of the exceptional talent of 25 year old guitar genius Remi Harris. Remi has played the guitar since he was six, formed his first rock band at 12, quit at 15 to learn to play jazz guitar properly. His trio play gypsy jazz like no one else. Their style is looser, swings differently to the traditional Reinhardt stylists and is clearly influenced by Remi's fascination with Wes Montgomery. His debut album Ninick on Big Bear Records is widely 5 Star reviewed and critically acclaimed.

RICKY COOL & THE IN CROWD

Ricky first hit the headlines with The Icebergs, only to reform as The Realtos where he came to the attention of ex-Led Zeppelin star Robert Plant who recruited him into his Honeydrippers.

Working with The Big Town Playboys began his longterm partnership with Andy Silvester of Savoy Brown and Chicken Shack. One of the hottest frontmen in the business, Ricky moved on to the unstoppable Hoola Boola Boys who toured with such greats as the legendary Jerry Lee Lewis. Now, with his new line up, Ricky Cool & The In Crowd, Ricky presents a musical mix of original numbers. ska, bluebeat, rock 'n' roll and rhythm 'n' blues, plus entertainment in the inimitable Ricky Cool style.

ROY FORBES

Roy Forbes is known to Birmingham festival audiences as a dynamic and exciting singer who has built a great reputation in the city over some years as well as





appearing (and recording at) London's Jazz Cafe and the Stables. Wavendon. and taking in other festivals as distant as Milan and St. Lucia, scoring a big success at the Limoges Jazz Festival ('an exceptional concert', according to Le Populaire du Centre). The Birmingham Mail wrote about Roy's performance in the 2011 Jazzfest, 'Is there a better male jazz singer in this country? Probably not. Roy Forbes is a master of his trade.'

RUDIE AND THE REVOLVERS

Recently voted the No.1 Ska and Soul tribute band around the UK, Rudie and The Revolvers have been together for some three years, playing all around the country and headlining at the Cavern in Liverpool in June, 2012, following a tour round the country supporting Bruce Foxton's From The Jam and Dexys Bootleg Runners.

THE RUMBLESTRUTTERS

The Rumblestrutters are a four-piece jug band based in south Wales, playing an irreverent hodgepodge of Memphis jazz, hokum blues and ragtime. The band have quickly established themselves as one of the best roots bands around. Started in the summer of 2013 when Jon Toft (mandolin and vocals) found an old ink jug in a back cupboard, the band also features the virtuoso quitar playing of Jonathan Nicholas, Liam Ward (vocals, jug and harmonica) and Grego Stockdale on washboard. thimbles, cans and anything that bangs. Feel-good folk music at its authentic best!

SAXITUDE (LUXEMBOURG)

The band Saxitude is a saxophone quartet that was founded in 2003 and has come up with a unique sound. Original compositions of jazz and improvised music are included in their repertory. The current



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members of the group are Pierre Cocq-Amann (soprano and alto sax), Remi Fox (alto sax), Robi Arend (tenor sax), and Thomas Diemert (baritone sax).

Since 2003 the band has played many concerts in Germany, Luxembourg, France, Switzerland and also in Slovenia, Czech Republic, Thailand and China.

SIMON KEMP RHYTHM & BLUES ORCHESTRA

The Simon Kemp Rhythm and Blues Orchestra is an eighteen piece band playing the best in soul, blues and big fat grooves. With a five piece rhythm section, loads of horns, four backing singers and guest vocalists, expect to sing, dance and get soaked in the good vibes this band puts out.

SIMON SPILLETT

His driving and energised style has often been compared with that of the late Tubby Haves and his approach shares a similar love of dare-devil tempos and all-out intensity.

STEVE AJAO


Steve Ajao has been a much respected figure on the Birmingham music scene for over 30 years. Starting as a drummer, he was working as a blues quitarist in various bands by his late teens. Later he reinvented himself as a bebop saxophonist, appearing in many London clubs and memorably sharing the bandstand with ex-Charlie Parker trumpeter Red Rodney. Both sides of Steve's musical personality are featured in the festival, with appearances by the Steve Ajao Quartet and his Blues Giants.

STEVEN SEAGAL'S BLUES BAND (U.S.A)

Featuring Big Bill Morganfield, Ernest Tibbs, The Fitzmaurice Twins, Marty Grebb, Redd Valkaert, Shad Cobb & Tom Hambridge

Steven Seagal is a bona fide Hollywood action legend, his films having grossed billions of dollars since the late 80's to the present day.

However what is sometime forgotten is that Steven has been an accomplished musician for many years now. He has honed his craft over the years sharing his love for the blues and

jamming with many of the greatest blues legends.

Critically acclaimed as one of the best blues albums released of 2007, his second CD *Mojo Priest* captured the essence of not only Steven's smooth yet gritty guitar style, but also the essence of Blues greats such as Muddy Waters and BB King.

STRUMPIT

The Hot Club-style trio Strumpit was formed in 2008 and the line-up of Andy Bucknall, Madi Stimpson and Michaël Lacoult is now well established. The main aim of the trio is to perform gypsy jazz and roots and folk music and to add a new twist with original compositions and arrangement of famous tunes.

STUART BARKER DUO

A classic jazz piano/double bass combination, the Stuart Barker Duo plays gems from the Great American Songbook.

PHOTOGRAPHER-AT-LARGE

Birmingham International Jazz and Blues Festival's regular photographer-at-large Merlin Daleman returns for the 2014 festival, in addition to being represented by an exhibition in the Blue Piano. Merlin lives in North Brabant in the Netherlands where his success as a photographer has led to his winning the Silver Camera Award for Best Documentary Photographer on two occasions: 2006 and 2008. A graduate of the Royal Academy of the Arts in The Hague, he is a regular contributor to NRC Handelsblad and NRC Next.

SUZI WOODS

Well versed in the Great American Songbook and an established singer/songwriter herself, Suzi Woods sang with Jools Holland's Swing Band in the 1990s. In recent years she has proved a hit with celebrities both fictional and real-life, singing both at Chardonnay and Kyle's wedding in Footballers' Wives and at the chastening of David and Victoria Beckham's two sons.

TIPITINA

Tipitina – with Debbie Jones' powerful gospel-tinged vocals and Justin Randall's mighty two-handed piano - deliver their own unique take on the blues, barrelhouse, boogie and gospel of New Orleans, in the footsteps of Professor Longhair, Dr. John, James Booker, Fats Domino and Allen Toussaint.

Tipitina's second CD for Big Bear, Taking Care of Business, recorded at 2011's Birmingham International Jazz & Blues Festival supported by Colmore BID, was greeted by uniformly enthusiastic reviews:

"A wonderful CD, it superbly captures how this incredible band sound au naturelle... phenomenal 10/10 [Blues In Britain].

"A joyous ride through up-



tempo feel-good rockers, gospel-tinged ballads and crowd-pleasing sing-alongs. They're a barnstorming live act, few do this with such conviction. [Rock 'N' Reel]

TOM ARMITAGE

Tom Armitage trained at the Birmingham Conservatoire and is now resident pianist at the Blue Piano where his beautiful improvisational style never fails to impress.

THE TREVOR BURTON

Trevor Burton was a founder member of the sixties chart topping band The Move, stayed with the band from 1966 to 1969, and since then has always been has kept at the centre of the rock music scene, from forming Balls with Steve Gibbons, Denny Laine and Allen White to working with Raymond

Froggatt, the Steve Gibbons Band, the Big Town Playboys and Dexy's Midnight Runners. Now he leads one of the most exciting live bands on the scene.

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA JAZZTET [USA]

The USF Jazztet is an exciting performance

VAL WISEMAN

Though best known for her highly successful Billie Holiday tribute, *Lady Sings the Blues*, Val Wiseman has much more on her CV, including two British Jazz Awards as Best Singer – in 2008 and 2011. She first gained national attention singing with the Monty Sunshine band and in

recent years has taken part in many different song programmes in addition to Lady Sings the Blues: Jazz Goes to the Movies with Digby Fairweather and Sophisticated Lady with Martin Litton, among others. In recent years she has developed and recorded her own musical tribute to the Brontes, Keeping the Flame Alive which she wrote with music by Brian Dee.

THE WHISKY BROTHERS

The Whisky Brothers featuring Richard Heath, on vocals and mandolin, and Gerry Smith, on piano, perform old style acoustic blues with songs from

the great American blues tradition as well as their own material. In the mid 1990s, Richard and Gerry formed the Splinter Blues Band which apart from performing at venues like Ronnie Scott's, also hosted a popular weekly blues club at the Hare and Hounds in south Birmingham for many vears. In 2012 they reunited to form the Whisky Brothers returning to their favourite style of music and the songs they most love to play.

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JAZZ ON THE HERITAGE TRAIL

The Birmingham International Jazz and Blues Festival is always on the look-out for different and interesting venues in which to showcase the music. Increasingly in recent years this has included historic and cultural sites. This year four of Birmingham's major heritage sites figure on the festival programme, with events every weekend lunch-time. First up is the city's Museum and Art Gallery on Saturday 19th, with the Precious Penny Pluckers providing the music. The following lunch-time it's the turn of Blakesley Hall, the 16th century manor house in Yardley, with the Arthur Brown Jazz Band. In the second weekend the museum on Saturday is the Museum of the Jewellery Quarter, with Festival Patron Digby Fairweather, and the historic building on Sunday is Sarehole Mill, the 18th century watermill in Hall Green, which hosts the Chase Jazzmen.

Another gallery which is now a very welcome regular in the festival programme, the Barber Institute of Fine Arts, turns its regular Friday lunch-time music programme over to jazz for two weeks in July. This year the Bruce Adams Quartet (18th) is followed by the Budapest Ragtime Band (25th).

FOUNDING DIRECTOR JIM SIMPSON

Thirty Years. It's been quite a journey. In some ways it feels an entire working life for some of us.

In the summer of 1984. in Cannon Hill Park, as the dust settled on The M&B Jam Session which featured 12 of Britain's leading jazzmen, there was widespread agreement that this was too good to let go. First of all there was the album: the Jam Session had been recorded on Richard Branson's Virgin Mobile and was released on Birmingham's Big Bear Records, going on to be named Sunday Times Jazz Album of the Year.

But what of the future? Humphrey Lyttelton, Benny Green, Malcolm Powell and I considered the possibilities. Humph and Benny were for a repeat performance the following year, but Malcolm, the Special Projects Manager at Mitchells & Butlers would have none of it, insisting that nothing less than a full-blown Festival would satisfy him. Of course, Malcolm had his way, he usually did. Thanks to Malcolm, M&B supported the Festival for the first five vears.Malcolm was as loval as he was inspirational, remaining the closest of friends until his untimely passing.

There have been many other friendships and far too many

losses, certainly too many to recount, but they are all remembered with affection and the afterglow that great music and good humour can bring. The indefatigable Humphrey Lyttelton, for many years our Patron, who brought so much to Birmingham and his favourite Jazz Festival; British jazz's other landmark trumpeter, Kenny Baker, whose reformed Dozen graced the Festival: the sagacity and unfailing humour of Benny Green; the genius and humility of Nat Pierce whose support went way beyond the call of duty; Duncan Swift the last of the line of great Harlem Stride Piano players: Gene 'The Mighty Flea' Connors from Birmingham Alabama, briefly domiciled in Brum when he had jumped ship from The Johnny Otis Show; one of the greatest tenormen of all time, Teddy Edwards who not only played beautifully here, but also freely contributed songs and arrangements; Claude 'Fiddler' Williams, a veteran of the 1936 Count Basie Band [on quitar] who loved Birmingham so much that he stayed over a month after filming Fiddlers Three at the

Equally significant are the numbers of musicians who have been part of the Festival throughout its 30 years. Remarkably Digby Fairweather, Len Skeat, Roy

Festival.

Williams and John Patrick featured in the 1985 Festival and, having been here for pretty much every one since, are again part of the 2014 bill.

By the time festival events were shooting past the 200 mark (in the third year) King Pleasure and the Biscuit Boys had debuted as Some Like it Hot and a one-off performance at the Adrian Boult Hall of *Lady Sings the Blues*, Val Wiseman's tribute to Billie Holiday, had launched a phenomenon that returns to the Festival this year.

But Birmingham is also about new names, youngsters who play real jazz and blues, developing and drawing on an often surprising variety of influences, playing with an enthusiasm and clear understanding of the music often with show-stopping musical ability. There are a lot of them around in this year's Festival. Have a listen to a band that you have never heard of and be prepared to be surprised.

And don't forget to buy the trumpet player a drink!



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



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




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
